WHEREAS, formal disciplinary proceedings were initiated against a student whose name is on file (hereinafter referred to as the “student”) with the Ramapo Indian Hills Regional High School District Board of Education (hereinafter referred to as the “Board”), regarding allegations that, on March 10, 2010, the student sold three (3) pills of Xanax, a controlled dangerous substance, to another high school student for thirty dollars (\$30), while at Ramapo High School, in violation of Board Policies and Regulations Nos. 5114 (Suspension and Expulsion), 5131 (Conduct/Discipline), 5131.6 (Drugs, Alcohol and Tobacco), the Ramapo Indian Hills Regional High School District Code of Student Conduct, N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2 (Causes for Suspension or Expulsion of Pupils), and N.J.S.A. 2C:35-5 (Manufacturing, distributing, dispensing controlled dangerous substances); and

WHEREAS, on or about May 18, 2010, the student’s parent(s) were provided with notice of a disciplinary hearing to be held before the Board on May 24, 2010, and of their right to be represented by counsel, to present evidence and witnesses on behalf of the student, to cross-examine any and all witnesses presented by the Board, and to have a translator present at the Board’s expense; and

WHEREAS, a disciplinary hearing took place on May 24, 2010, at which time the student and the student’s mother appeared before the Board; and

WHEREAS, at the May 24, 2010 hearing, the administration presented its evidence against the student, who was given the opportunity to cross-examine the witnesses, and the student and the student’s mother made statements on the student’s behalf; and

WHEREAS, the Board has considered all of the evidence, the student’s academic, attendance, and disciplinary records, Board Policies and Regulations Nos. 5114 (Suspension and Expulsion), 5131 (Conduct/Discipline), 5131.6 (Drugs, Alcohol and

Tobacco), the Ramapo Indian Hills Regional High School District Code of Student Conduct, N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2 (Causes for Suspension or Expulsion of Pupils), and N.J.S.A. 2C:35-5 (Manufacturing, distributing, dispensing controlled dangerous substances);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Board hereby determines, based upon a preponderance of the competent and credible evidence, that, on March 10, 2010, the student was in possession of and distributed Xanax, a controlled dangerous substance, to another student while on school grounds, in violation of the aforementioned policies, regulations, and statutes, and further determines that such conduct is grounds for discipline.
2. In light of the serious nature of the conduct, the student shall be removed from Ramapo High School for the remainder of the 2009-2010 school year and from September 1, 2010 through the end of the first marking period of the 2010-2011 school year, effective immediately.
3. During the period of suspension, individual counseling services and academic support shall be made available to the student as appropriate, with the specific services offered being subject to the discretion of the Superintendent.
4. The student shall not be present on any of the Board's school campuses outside of or during the regularly scheduled school day during the period of suspension, unless authorized by the Superintendent.
5. During the period of suspension, the student shall be allowed to be present on the Board's school campuses with the express authorization of the Superintendent for the following permissible purposes: to complete standardized testing, such as the ACT or SAT tests, or to confer with guidance personnel for the sole purpose of completing college applications.
6. The student shall not be permitted to participate in any athletic, co-curricular and/or extra-curricular activities sponsored by the Board and shall not be present for or attend any Board-sponsored activities either on campus or in any school district where the school is participating in the activities during the period of his suspension.
7. During the period of suspension from Ramapo High School, the student shall be provided with an alternative educational program, pursuant to State and Federal laws, that meets the Core Curriculum Standards in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:8-1.1 et seq.
8. The Superintendent shall report to the Board at each subsequent Board meeting for the purpose of determining the status of the student's suspension and the appropriateness of the current educational program.
9. Further engagement by the student in conduct warranting expulsion pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2 and/or failure to comply with any of the aforementioned terms and conditions shall amount to a knowing and voluntary waiver of the student's right to a free and appropriate public education in the event that a decision to expel the student is made by the Board pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.5.

4. The student shall not be present on any of the Board's school campuses outside of or during the regularly scheduled school day during the period of suspension, unless authorized by the Superintendent.

5. During the period of suspension, the student shall be allowed to be present on the Board’s school campuses with the express authorization of the Superintendent for the following permissible purposes: to complete standardized testing, such as the ACT or SAT tests, or to confer with guidance personnel for the sole purpose of completing college applications.
6. The student shall not be permitted to participate in any athletic, co-curricular and / or extra-curricular activities sponsored by the Board and shall not be present for or attend any Board-sponsored activities either on campus or in any school district where the school is participating in the activities during the period of his suspension.
7. During the period of suspension from Ramapo High School, the student shall be provided with an alternative educational program, pursuant to State and Federal laws, that meets the Core Curriculum Standards in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:8-1.1 et seq.
8. The Superintendent shall report to the Board at each subsequent Board meeting for the purpose of determining the status of the student’s suspension and the appropriateness of the current educational program.
9. Further engagement by the student in conduct warranting expulsion pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2 and / or failure to comply with any of the aforementioned terms and conditions shall amount to a knowing and voluntary waiver of the student’s right to a free and appropriate public education in the event that a decision to expel the student is made by the Board pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:37-2 and N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.5.
